



TRIO SSS students -- upon completing their academic programs, while participating in TRIO SSS -- receive a red, black and white cord to wear with their cap and gown. These cords designate their affiliation with the National TRIO Programs.





Dr. Carissa Henry, Licensed Professional Counselor, M.A.P.C.C-S, D.Min. Motivational speaker Stacey Flowers defines happiness as unleashing your talent to positively influence the world. Americans tend to think that once they are successful they will be happy, however, happiness happens before success.

Yet, how do you achieve that happiness? Harvard researcher Dr. Shawn Achor found that relationships have the deepest impact on our happiness more than any other factor. Additionally, motivational speaker Jim Rohn says you are the average of the five people that you choose to associate with the most. While social psychologist Dr. David McClelland of Harvard says, "the people you habitually associate with determine as much as 95 percent of your success or failure in life."

The time you spend with others impacts your own talent to positively influence the world. The conversations you have with others dominates your attention and can impact your attitude and behavior. By identifying the people in your life who fits the following roles and connecting with them you can increase your happiness as soon as today!

5 People That Can Increase Your Happiness TODAY!

The Cheerleader – This person is the person who unconditionally believes in you. This person believes in you when you cannot believe in yourself.

The Mentor – This person always points you in the right direction. A relationship with a mentor does not have to be formal. This person is willing and able to share information with you and can point you in the direction you need to go.





The Coach – This person's job is to make you a little bit uncomfortable in order to make things happen. This person helps you maximize your potential and become stronger.

The Friend – This is the one person who knows your heart's desires and helps you identify and go for them. They do not have to understand any of your jobs or roles, they just have to understand you.
