

CREDITS, ACADEMIC COURSES AND DEGREE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS**Policy No. 4-04****Page 1 of 1****Effective date: March 6, 2013****Last date reviewed: August 5, 2021**

- A. Eastern Gateway Community College will follow the federal and local regulations to establish the relationship between college credit and the necessary time for the delivery of that credit.
- B. A college credit course is a course which fulfills a requirement for graduation in an associate degree program.
- C. A developmental educational course is a course designed for students who need to remediate or acquire knowledge that better prepares them to succeed in a college course or program. Credits earned in Developmental Education do not fulfill degree requirements.
- D. Each degree program will require a minimum of 60 semester hours of college level courses that follow a certain distribution of courses within disciplines.
- E. Each EGCC Degree Program is approved by the Board of Trustees upon recommendation of the EGCC faculty and in accordance with Ohio Board of Regents standards, college level standards, accreditation requirements and any other regulatory body requirements regarding the completion of college degrees.
- F. The president or designee will establish procedures for the implementation of this policy.
